



Assessing the Health of your Local Democracy

Local government should be accessible and accountable, but low participation and engagement are a threat to the health of any democracy and ultimately the overall health of our communities. A range of factors can provide insight into how inclusive, responsive and accountable government is in your community.

Voter Turnout

- What is the voter turnout and participation in local elections?
- Which districts have the highest rates of voter participation? Does this tell a story about power and resource allocation in your community?
- Whose votes and power are missing in local elections and policy? (Factors might include age, home ownership, justice involvement and race)
- Does one party dominate in local politics? What is the voter turnout in the last primary election? ,

Civic Engagement

- Is there active engagement in city council and other public meetings?
- Are there community groups engaging people in civic life?
- Do citizens feel they can voice concerns? Are elected officials readily available to the public?

Access to Information

- Is local government information readily available and transparent? (This includes information about elected officials, boards and commissions, and local public agencies.)
- Are meetings open and transparent?
- Is there a strong local media presence?
- Can you find information on local party committees, their meetings, members, and how to join?

Representation and Accountability

- Are elections conducted fairly? Do all constituents have access to the information and tools they need to vote?
- Do local elected leaders reflect the diversity of the community?

Government Responsiveness

- Do elected officials respond to citizen concerns?
- Do voters hold leaders accountable through their votes?

Ethics and Transparency

- Are there strong ethical standards for local officials?
- Are financial dealings transparent?
